Ordinances

Sec. 2-607.1. - Historic Preservation Commission established.

(a)

Commission established; name; purpose. A Commission of architectural review is hereby established pursuant to S.C. Code 1976, § 6-29-870, to be known as the "Historic Preservation Commission of Chester," for the purposes of preservation and protection of historic and architecturally valuable districts and neighborhoods, significant or natural scenic. areas, and the unique or special character of historic districts and historic structures.

(b)

Composition. The Commission shall be composed of seven (7) members appointed by City Council for terms of four (4) years, staggered so that the term of at least one (1) member expires in each year. Terms of office shall begin with the calendar year. No person who holds any other public office or position in the City may be a member of the Commission. Members shall not be compensated for service. A member of the Commission may be removed by majority vote of City Council. Vacancies shall be filled by appointment by City Council.

Sec. 56-4. - Trucks prohibited on certain streets.

It shall be unlawful for any person to operate a truck exceeding 25 feet in length, except emergency vehicles, without a permit from the Police Chief on any street which has been designated by resolution of City Council and posted pursuant to S.C. Code 1976, § 56-5-720, with signs prohibiting trucks.

Sec. 56-2. - Speed limits.

Where no special hazard exists, it shall be unlawful to operate any vehicle in the City in excess of the following maximum reasonable and safe speeds:

Twenty-five miles per hour in any business district;

(2)

Twenty-five miles per hour in any school zone during the hours posted.

(3)

Thirty-five miles per hour in any residential district; or (Code 1995, § 9-402)

Sec. 56-3. - Through freight prohibited.

It shall be unlawful for any person to operate a truck transporting goods upon any City street, except goods picked up or delivered to a point within the City, without written designation of a safe route issued by the Police Chief.

(Code 1995, § 9-403)

Sec. 56-4. - Trucks prohibited on certain streets.

It shall be unlawful for any person to operate a truck exceeding 25 feet in length, except emergency vehicles, without a permit from the Police Chief on any street which has been designated by resolution of City Council and posted pursuant to S.C. Code 1976, § 56-5-720, with signs prohibiting trucks.
