Public Works



A 90-gallon roll cart is provided to each home for storage and collection of garbage. It is emptied ONCE A WEEK.

Any excess garbage must be placed in a City-approved bag. These bags are ONLY available at City Hall and cost \$2 each. Roll carts and bins should be removed from the curb by 7 p.m. Residents can order an additional roll cart for \$21.



This fee will be added to the customer's water bill. There is no charge to use additional recycling bins and doing so can help reduce the volume of garbage in the roll cart.

Parks & Recreation




Chester Parks & Recreation Department provides recreational and special activities for the City of Chester,




We have already started planning for summer 2020 and we want to provide as much community information as possible. We will







CHILI CHEESE DIP submitted by the Police Department

- 1-15oz can of chili by Hormel
- 1-8oz block of cream cheese
- 1-large cup of shredded cheese
- 1-bag of Fritos Scoops

- 1/2 cup mayonnaise
- 5 ears corn, husks and silk removed
- 1 cup shredded Parmesan
- Chili powder
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper

Prepare grill. Brush a thin layer of mayonnaise on corn. Sprinkle the corn with cheese, chili powder, salt and pepper. Wrap each corn with foil and place on the grill. Turn occasionally and cook for about 10 minutes (until kernels begin to brown). Serve warm.


Carla's notes: I use frozen mini corn on the cob. Place the corn in a bowl of water and place in the microwave for 5 minutes. Drain off
